Today the Tribute Western Counties West League enters week 18 and we are delighted to host local rivals, St Austell, for what promises to be a classic mid table battle. There is little to choose between the two sides. The Saints form is currently better, with two wins in the last four. However, it was against St Austell that the Hakes began a run of six wins in seven outings back in October. It will be interesting to see who shows greater desire and fitness, and which game plan succeeds.

Those who have long been supporters will know that St Austell were never classed as local, with Redruth, Camborne, Pirates, Hayle, Falmouth, Penryn and Newquay all closer. But league rugby has changed all that. In 2010-11 they gained promotion from the Cornwall & Devon league. Two seasons later they were WCW champions and spent a couple of years in the SW1(W) league, finishing 4th in 2013-14. Their progress is so typical of clubs in this era; a period of progress with a stable, experienced side, which proves hard to maintain. Now, back in WCW, the sides meet at St Ives for the first time since January 21st 2012, when St Austell took the points.

On paper the St Ives team looks strong, with Parma stepping up to centre for the on duty Nicholas. Can this group provide the cohesion and discipline to take the points?
